

Part 1- Our Student Safeguarding Officers

- 1. Ballarat Grammar has appointed the people listed below as the School's Student Safeguarding Officers. Each Student Safeguarding Officer is available to answer any questions that you may have with respect to our Student Safety policies.
- 2. Student Safeguarding Officers are selected based on a number of considerations, namely:
 - 2.1 Their personal attitudes, experiences and beliefs, for example, a person who is non-judgmental, calm, resilient and demonstrates a high degree of integrity and respect for confidentiality;
 - 2.2 Their role within the School, for example, a person who has seniority and experience working with complex student and family issues at the School and someone who is readily accessible and available to all members of the School community; and
 - 2.3 Their personal profile within the School for example, a person who is approachable, who students and staff trust and who is willing and able to respond to issues personally and sensitively.
- 3. The School's Student Safeguarding Officers can be your first point of contact for reporting child protection issues within the School. These individuals are also the first contact for anyone (i.e. a mentor) whose student has made a disclosure.
- 4. If you have any concerns that a student may be experiencing any form of abuse, whether or not you have formed a belief on reasonable grounds that the abuse has occurred, you should immediately raise your concerns with one of our Student Safeguarding Officers. Please be aware that consulting with a Student Safeguarding Officer does not change any obligation you have under legislation to report to an external authority. Refer to our *Procedures for Responding to and Reporting Allegations of Child Abuse*.
- 5. Our Student Safeguarding Officers are held to a higher record keeping standard than other staff and are responsible for fulfilling all record keeping obligations per the public record office record keeping standards and requirements for each incident.
- 6. The welfare and best interests of the student are paramount. Whenever there are concerns that a student is in immediate danger the Police should be called on 000.
